

## **SPECIAL AWARDS MANUSCRIPT REQUIREMENTS**

### **Casselberry Award**

The Casselberry Award has been established to encourage the advancement of the art and science of laryngology. Those competing for this award must submit a completed manuscript (1 copy) to Maxine Cunningham via email (maxine.c@comcast.net) by the published deadline on the abstract submission form. Competition for this award will be limited to those persons whose abstracts are selected for a podium presentation at the annual meeting.

After an evaluation of the manuscripts by the Casselberry Award Committee, recommendations will be forwarded to the Council for a final decision. The award is given for outstanding manuscripts or accomplishments in laryngology and consists of a suitable sum of money (up to \$1,000) and a plaque to each author from the Association.

### **Eugene N. Myers International Award in Laryngology**

The Eugene N. Myers Award for International Laryngology is funded by Dr. Myers, an ALA past president. This award will be given on an annual basis associated with the annual meeting. A scientific submission (oral or poster) that represents excellence in scientific contribution to the field of laryngology will be recommended by the program committee and approved by the ALA Council. The first author must be based outside of the United States and Canada. Those wishing to compete for this award must submit their entry on an American Laryngology Association abstract form by the designated deadline. A cash prize (\$1,000 USD) and certificate will be awarded during either the annual meeting or the Presidential reception.

### **Young Faculty/Practitioner Award**

In consideration for the Young Faculty/Practitioner Award, the Program Committee will select an abstract based on predetermined scoring. A request must be made at time of submitting the abstract by checking the appropriate box on page one (1) of the abstract. The presenting author must hold the title of assistant professor and be up to five years in academic practice. An author in non-academic practice is eligible for the award up to five years after completion of training. A cash prize (\$1,000 USD) and certificate will be awarded during the annual meeting.

### **Resident Research Award**

In consideration for the Resident Research Award, the Program Committee will select an abstract based on predetermined scoring. A request must be made at time of submitting the abstract by checking the appropriate box on page one (1) of the abstract. The presenting author must have not completed their residency training. A cash prize (\$500 USD) and certificate will be awarded during the annual meeting.
